

Updated 2010 Winter Games Marine Information

If you plan to operate a vessel during the Vancouver 2010 Olympic and Paralympic Winter Games period in or near the waters of the four areas identified to the right, please be aware that special security measures will be in effect. The marine security measures will be in place between mid-January and the end of March, 2010. They are designed to protect and safeguard athletes, spectators, and general public participating in the 2010 Winter Games.

In the four areas shown to the right, marine security personnel will be monitoring all maritime activities. Vessels that seem to be operating unusually or that are non-compliant will be closely scrutinized by security authorities in these areas.

In the Coal Harbour, False Creek and Fraser River areas shown to the right, access will be managed using two types of zones.

- Exclusion Zone**—No activities are allowed within the set perimeter.
- Controlled Access Zone**—Access to or through this area may take place after authorization by the Integrated Security Unit.

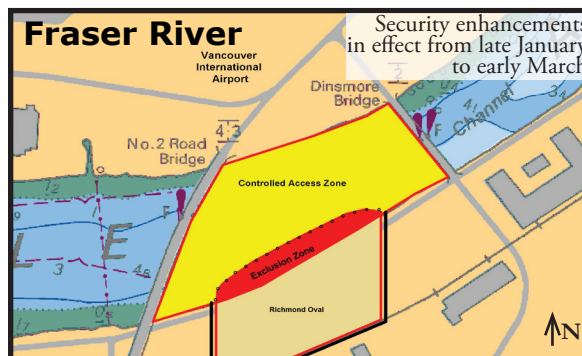
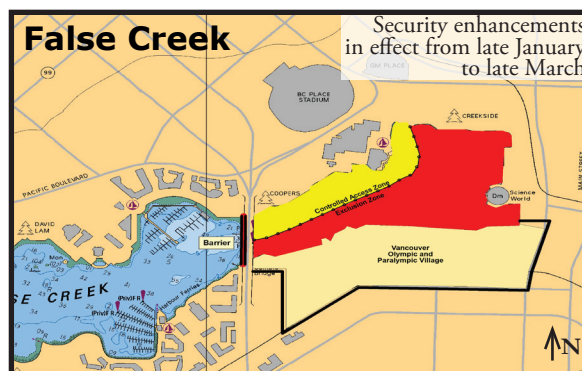
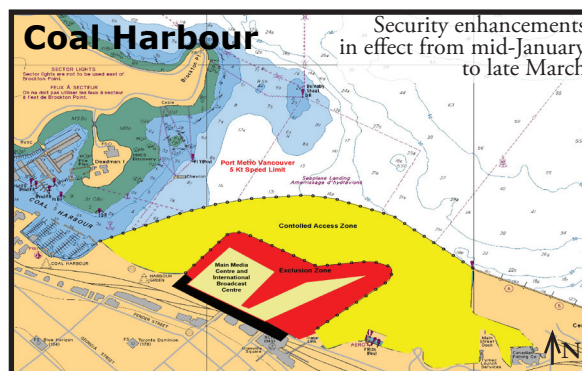
Controlled Access Zone procedures will be published in Notices to Mariners closer to the 2010 Winter Games period. In the Sea to Sky Corridor, enhanced security surveillance will be in effect.
